

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on January 12, 2016, by Chairperson, Janet J. Henning. Present were Marvin A. Kohout, Willis D. Luedke, Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek and Tim McDermott, Commissioners, and Daryl Fikar, Deputy County Clerk. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Henning advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Kohout moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Luedke, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under Correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a Bulk Sample Analysis Report from ATC Group Services, LLC for asbestos testing that was done in the Courthouse. The testing found no asbestos in the tested samples. Fikar also reported receiving a check from Interface Security Systems for \$2.00 and a check from Zito Midwest for \$61.00, both for 911 Surcharges, and reported receiving the minutes from Friend Community Healthcare System's December 29, 2015 meeting, and approving a Special Designated License for Saline Center Lodge for an event on January 23, 2016.

At 9:31, Luedke moved to adjourn sine die, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, McDermott, Luedke and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Purpose of this action is to reorganize and elect or re-elect a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson.

County Attorney, Tad Eickman, asked for nominations from the floor for Chairperson. Henning nominated Kohout, and Luedke nominated McDermott. Eickman announced that the nominations would cease and a secret ballot would be used to elect the Chairperson. After collecting the ballots, Eickman counted and Fikar recorded the votes. The results of the votes were: Kohout, 3, McDermott, 2. Kohout receiving the majority of votes is elected as Chairperson of the Board of Equalization and Board of Commissioners for the 2016 calendar year.

Kohout then asked for nominations from the floor for Vice-Chairperson. Henning nominated McDermott, seconded by Luedke. After repeating the call for nominations three times, Henning requested that the nominations cease and cast unanimous votes for McDermott, all voted aye. McDermott is elected as Vice-Chairman of the Board of Equalization and Board of Commissioners for the 2016 calendar year.

At 9:36, County Court Judge Linda Bauer swore in Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi, Assistant Highway Superintendent Bill Slezak, Bridge Foreman Rick Korbelik, Weed Superintendent and Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber and Veterans' Service Officer Forrest Doyle to their respective duties for the 2016 calendar year.

At 9:40, Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber presented to the Board an Administrative Subdivision on behalf of Norm Schluter to amend a previous subdivision, adding 1.38 acres. Henning moved to approve the amendment, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

Weber then gave his annual report to the Board, stating that he generally sprays all county owned property at least once every three years, unless he has a report of a problem area, which gets immediate attention. He also discussed areas where he does not spray, as requested by adjacent landowners. Luedke moved to accept Weber's annual report, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 9:53, Dan Johnson, maintenance head, reported that he had received a request from the Extension Office to install button activated door opener on one of the doors to the Extension/County Attorney building. He had solicited and received a bid from Wilber Windows and Doors for \$2,487.28. After discussion, McDermott





moved to accept the bid, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:10, Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess;

At 10:27, Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene;

John McKee, Emergency Management Director for Jefferson County came before the board to offer his services as interim Emergency Management Director for Saline County. He previously helped Gage County during their search for a new Director. After discussing duties and compensation, McDermott moved to appoint John McKee as interim Emergency Management Director for Saline County, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott, Luedke, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the list of Appointments and Policies for 2016, seconded by McDermott. Voting ave were Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the County Clerk's Report of Fees for December in the amount of \$10,836.24, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting ave were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Clerk of District Court Report of Fees for December in the amount of \$3,532.50, seconded by McDermott. Voting ave were Kohout, Krivohlavek, McDermott, Luedke and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:10, Saline County Treasurer Debbie Spanyers presented County Treasurer's Semi-Annual Statement, ending December 31, 2015. Henning moved to approve the statement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting ave were McDermott, Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Ms. Spanyers then updated the board, giving the report of investments and pledged collateral activity.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2016-01, transferring \$300.00 from the General Fund to the Grant Fund, seconded by McDermott. This money will be reimbursed to the General Fund as Grant monies are received. Voting ave were Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:20, Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented Resolution #2016-02, which is an agreement with Nebraska Department of Roads for Project #HRRR-STWD(128). This project is for bridge and culvert object marker signing. Henning moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting ave were McDermott, Kohout, Luedke, Krivohlavek and Henning, navs none, motion carried.

Filipi then requested signatures on the culvert bids that were approved four weeks ago.

Filipi then informed the Board about a message that he had received from Keep Nebraska Beautiful, concerning the used oil collection program. They are notifying us that the price that they are paying for used oil has changed; they are no longer paying 5 cents per gallon, and are now going to charge 25 cents per gallon to collect the oil. The Board questioned whether Keep Nebraska Beautiful can change the price in the middle of a contract, which runs through August 31, 2016, and whether Saline County can find another company to pick up



the oil without charging for the collection. County Attorney Eickman will research the conditions of the contract.

Filipi also notified the Board that he and FEMA had visited all 8 bridge sites that are being replaced or repaired as a result of last year's floods.

At 11:48, Krivohlavek moved to enter closed session, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Luedke, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Kohout stated that the purpose of closed session is to discuss a compensation and taxing matter and GA#2016-01.

At 12:33, Krivohlavek moved to exit closed session, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, McDermott, Luedke and Henning, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that during closed session, the Board discussed a compensation and taxing matter and GA#2016-01, and no action was taken.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the claims with the addition of claim #16010001, pulled during the last meeting, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott, Luedke, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.



McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:37 a.m. on March 8, 2016, by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Willis D. Luedke, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek and Tim McDermott, Commissioners, and Daryl Fikar, County Clerk. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda with the addition of possible litigation in closed session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the February 23, 2016 meeting, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under Correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a \$64.00 check from Zito Media for 9-11 surcharges; a \$2,308.50 check from the Village of DeWitt for law enforcement services; a \$25.16 check from RGA as a dividend payment; the 2015 annual report from NIRMA and the minutes of the February 23rd meeting of Friend Community Healthcare System Board of Directors.

McDermott reported attending the Safety Committee meeting on February 24; reminded the Board of the annual spring training to be held on March 24 at the Extension/County Attorney building. The subject of the training is Severe Weather Awareness, and will be conducted by John McKee, Saline County Interim Emergency Management Director; attended a Wellness Committee meeting on March 1, and met with representatives of Madonna to receive the individual results of the health fair; attended the monthly courthouse addition construction meeting; met with D.A. Davison and Ameritas for interviews to select a company to administrate any future Saline County bonds, reporting that he was very impressed with both companies and that a formal decision regarding which company to use would be made in a few weeks; coming up, he has a SENDD Board meeting and a Drug and Alcohol Coalition Meeting.

Krivohlavek reported attending an Aging Services Executive Meeting on February 29 and reminded the Board that Saline County Aging Services is hosting a town hall meeting in the conference room at the Extension/County Attorney building tonight at 5:30, and that they are hosting an immunization clinic on March 9; reported attending a wind meeting hosted by Aksamit Resources on Sunday where she heard that the company is starting to send checks to landowners that have signed with them.

Kohout reported attending a Safety Committee meeting on February 24 where they discussed the dust in the courthouse due to the construction; a Saline/Seward solid waste meeting; attended the wind meeting with Aksamit Resources; a Steering Committee meeting in Crete; a Wellness Committee meeting with Madonna on March 7 and noted that he believes that Madonna is doing a good job with our health fairs; and noted that the County Employee recognition banquet will be on April 1

Luedke reported attending a construction meeting with the architect and contractors on Monday and noted that the architect is working to get the fiber-optic line installed between the courthouse and the law enforcement center for the surveillance cameras that will be installed and that there will be a couple of change orders coming through, notably with the phone system, as the current system is running at capacity now, but we will be adding several offices to the courthouse, so the system will need to be updated; they also discussed the dust that is settling around the courthouse, assuring the Board that the dust contains no asbestos, as all possible materials have been tested. The contractors informed him that there is available a machine that is generally used in hospitals during construction that will clean the air to a state more pure than outside air. This option is being considered; He attended the reading classic on Thursday where there were 16 teams participating and 15 volunteers to help. He noted that a debt of gratitude is owed to Bonnie Bleich of the Highway Superintendent's Office for organizing the event. Luedke also obtained information from the City of Crete which indicates that



there are approximately 3,300 people that commute to Crete from outside areas every day to work, and that a marketing plan may be implemented to entice those people to take up residence in Saline County.

Henning reported attending a Behavioral Health Advisory Committee meeting on March 2, and has a regional meeting on March 14; a meeting with Public Health Solutions on March 17 and helped with the Reading Classic.

At 10:05, Brad Swiggart, Lowell Eisenhauer and Amber Anderson-Vrana of Northwestern Mutual made a presentation to the board concerning the upcoming renewal for the County's health insurance. The Board will take the information under advisement.

Cindy Essam of CASA was present to update the Board on their activities, indicating that they recently have five people graduate from their training program, that the march against child abuse display will be at the Gage County courthouse beginning April 2, and that there will be a Superhero race on May 1 at Chautauqua Park in Beatrice.

At 10:35, Jane Ford-Witthoff with Public Health Solutions provided to the Board their 2015 annual report, detailing their programs and services and the number of people, by county, that have been served.

At 10:45 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short break.

At 10:55 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Linda Kastanek was present to receive a plaque signed by the Board, honoring her for 30 years of service to Saline County, 10 years of that as Saline County Clerk.

At 11:05, Henning moved to enter Executive Session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that during closed session, the Board would be discussing GA#2016-02, BA#2016-01 and possible litigation.

At 1:05 p.m., Henning moved to exit closed session, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that during closed session the Board discussed possible litigation, GA#2016-02 and #BA2016-01. The Board tabled GA#2016-02 pending more information, Luedke moved to approve BA#2016-01 in the amount of \$1,400.00, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Henning, McDermott, Krivohlavek and Luedke, nays none, motion carried. Luedke then moved to authorize the County Attorney and Sheriff's Dept. to begin acquiring the appropriate resources that would perform a complete investigation, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Clerk of the District Court's report of fees for February in the amount of \$6,525.00, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

The Board discussed the process for interviewing the applicants for the Emergency Manager position. It was decided that all Commissioners would review the applications, then forward their choices to the Chairman. Any candidate that received three or more favorable reviews would be contacted to appear for an interview. The interviews will take place on the afternoon of March 22 in the Commissioners meeting room.

At 12:40, Kohout reminded the Board of a discussion noted in the November 17, 1992 Board minutes. The entry involved Commissioner Kenneth Kreshel and Deputy County Attorney Chris Horacek. Horacek recommended to the Board that someone representing the Commissioners be present during Sheriff's sales, to ensure that the minimum bid on properties so sold meet the minimum requirement to protect the County's interest in the property.

At 12:43 Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented two requests to occupy right-of-way from Windstream. They are both for the construction of telecommunication facilities, one between sections 21-6-2 and 28-6-2 and the other in section 28-6-4. Luedke moved to approve both requests, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Kohout, McDermott and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then informed the board that Saline County has recently received approximately \$43,000.00 from NEMA, bring the total so far to approximately \$75,000.00. As part of his update to the Board, Filipi informed them that the Roads Department had recently discovered four additional culverts that must be replaced due to deterioration.



Henning moved to approve the claims with the addition of \$1,400.00 for BA#2016-01, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.



Under Correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a letter from the Lincoln/Lancaster County Planning Dept. regarding their position on whether to recommend a permit for Avalon Event Center, the SENDD Budget/Nominating Committee May 26th meeting minutes and the agenda for their Board of Directors June 16th meeting, a budget request from Public Health Solutions for their SKIP flu program, a notice of hearing from the Lancaster County Clerk regarding the June 28th hearing for consideration of a permit for Avalon Event Center, a progress report from Aksamit Energy Development regarding their windfarm development, a signed agreement between Southeast Nebraska Adult Court and Kalkwarf and Smith Law Offices, LLC, the minutes of the Friend Community Healthcare System's May 18th meeting and a check from Windstream for \$7,455 for 911 surcharges.

Under report of officials, Henning reported attending an LEPC meeting on May 3rd and a Region V Regional Governing Board meeting on June 13, and has a CISDA meeting coming up on June 21st.

Luedke reported attending a meeting with the contractors and architects working on the courthouse addition, meeting with staff from the Probation Office on June 7th regarding their office layout and security system, and that another meeting with the contractors and architects on June 28th may have to be rescheduled due to other county commitments.

Kohout reported attending the NACO Board workshop in Kearney, a Saline/Seward Solid Waste meeting last week, checked abandoned cemeteries on June 15th, and informed the Board of two meetings with a new wind developer, one in Ohiowa on June 15th and one in Tobias on June 16th.

Krivohlavek reported attending the NACO workshop in Kearney and has an Aging Services Board and budget meeting coming up on June 27th.

McDermott reported attending the NACO workshop, a meeting with the contractors and architects working on the courthouse addition, a meeting with Probation staff regarding their office layout and security system, attended a Drug and Alcohol Prevention Coalition meeting on June 7th where they discussed the 2016 Czech Days teen dance and Red Ribbon Week, and, coming up, an Identity and Marking Committee meeting on June 15th, a Wellness Committee meeting on June 20, a NIFA luncheon at Doane University on June 20th, and a Saline County Tourism meeting and lunch on June 23rd.

At 9:43, Saline County Tourism Committee members Lorene Mares, Sheryl Kastanek, Deb Polacek, Jim Rischling, Janet Jeffries and Gary Wooten were present to clarify to the Board their process for awarding tourism and improvement grants. The Board asked that the Committee give them more time to review their recommendations, and that the County Clerk should make copies of all of the applications so they can review them prior to the recommendations being made.

At 10:16, EMT Phillip Oelschlager and Crete Area Medical Center CFO Doug Kucera were present to report to the Board the results of their research into a new lease or possible purchase of the vehicle currently being used as the ALS (intercept) vehicle. Kucera reports that the current vehicle, a 2013 Ford Explorer has only 12,000 miles on it and he would expect it to last for many more years. The price to purchase this vehicle after the lease expires would be \$19,359.00. Oelschlager mentioned that the current vehicle could be updated



with a grill guard, to protect the front of the vehicle and as a place to mount the sirens so they could better be heard. These updates, along with exterior graphics, would cost an additional \$1,800 to \$2,000. He believes that this would still be a better option given the fact that the current equipment may not fit in a new lease vehicle, which would cost approximately \$7,000. As the current lease expires in November of 2016, the Board asked that the issue be brought up again in the fall.

At 10:30, Commissioner Henning left the meeting.

At 10:40, Aging Services Director Amy Hansen was present to discuss budget concerns with the Board. It was decided that the budget will need to be re-opened to amend fund #2250. This will take place at the June 28th Board of Commissioners meeting by opening a public hearing.

At 11:05 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short break.

At 11:20 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Crete City Administrator Tom Ourada, Jim Krause and Library Director Lisa Olivigni were present to discuss the possibility of entering into an interlocal agreement with Saline County, which would make it possible for the City of Crete to raise their sales tax rate by one-half cent in order to finance either the conversion of an existing building into a new library, or financing the construction of a new library. The building would also have a hardened lower level to be used as a shelter during emergencies. This project is still in the investigative stage, so the Board asked that they keep them up to date on the progress.

SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:35 a.m. on June 28th, 2016, by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Willis D. Luedke, Janet J. Henning, and Tim McDermott, Commissioners, and Daryl Fikar, County Clerk. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments. Commissioner Stephanie A. Krivohlavek was absent.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

McDermott moved to approve the agenda, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the minutes of the June 14th, 2016 meeting, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Luedke, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under Correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the minutes of the May 12th Veteran's Memorial Committee meeting, the minutes of the May 5th Veteran's Service Committee meeting, the agenda for the SENDD June 30th meeting, the Public Health Solutions May 19th meeting minutes and their May 2016 staff report, the Aging Services Board June 27th meeting agenda, a \$1.00 check from Granite Telecommunications, a \$19.00 check from Vonage, and a \$12.00 check from Level 3 Communications, all for 911 surcharges, the Blue Valley Community Action June 21st meeting agenda and the minutes of their April 19th meeting as well as their June 2016 Report to the Board of Directors and their April/May news clippings. Also received was the Aging Partners Areawide Advisory Council June 22 meeting agenda, the Saline County Agricultural Society's June 8th meeting minutes and the Regional Governing Board June 13th meeting minutes.

Under report of officials, McDermott reported attending the June 15th Identity and Marking Committee meeting, advising the Board that the Committee is within a couple of weeks of presenting a Saline County flag and Saline County seal to the Board for their consideration, he also attended a June 20th Wellness Committee meeting, the NIFA luncheon at Doane University on June 20th, and, coming up, will be taking the quarterly jail tour at SCLEC today, a construction meeting tomorrow, a June 30th SENDD Executive Board meeting in Lincoln and the July 5th and 7th Protest hearings.

Henning reported attending a CASA meeting on June 21st, the NIFA luncheon at Doane University on June 20th and a Blue Valley Community Action meeting on June 21st.

Luedke reported attend an RC&D meeting in Tecumseh, where they discussed and tentatively scheduled a household hazardous waste collection for August 27th in Crete, a Saline County Tourism meeting and tour in Western, and the NIFA luncheon at Doane University. He also advised the Board that the floor for the 4th floor in the courthouse addition is now in place, the walls will be going up next week, and the contractors are still predicting to have the roof on by August 1st. Coming up, he has a Veteran's Memorial meeting tomorrow at 5:00.

Kohout reported taking a tour of the new Judicial Center in Seward, attending a Wellness Committee meeting on June 20th, an Employee Handbook Committee meeting on June 21st, investigated a road complaint with the Highway Superintendent, and attended the wind energy meeting in Tobias. He advised the Board that the company that hosted the meeting is named APEX clean energy, and that they have already built wind farms in other parts of the country.

Aging Services Director Amy Hansen was present to explain to the Board that there were expenses to Fund 2250 that were not predicted when



the budget was written. Aging Services does have a "reserve", but these funds were not budgeted for the current year.

At 10:01 a.m., Henning moved to close the public hearing, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, Henning, Luedke and McDermott, voting nay, none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve amending the Aging Services budget by increasing the total budget by \$10,000, from \$167,800.00 to \$177,800.00

At 10:02, Aging Partners Director Randy Jones presented the 2016 Saline County Report to the Board. Also present were Trudy Kubicek, Nancy Kohler, Kathy Stokebrand and Denise Boyd. Jones thanked the Board for their past support and presented their budget request of \$28,505.00 for the 2016-17 year. The Board will take this under consideration.

Commissioner Krivohlavek arrived at 10:04.

At 10:17 a.m., Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber presented to the Board two minor subdivisions, one for Loren Vyhnalek, who is selling a portion of his property to a contiguous property owner, R.J. and Nicole Zurcher. The subdivision was unanimously approved by the Planning and Zoning Board. Luedke moved to approve the request, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Luedke, McDermott, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

The other request was made by Dean Korinek, who is gifting 4.6 acres to a relative to construct a home. This subdivision was also unanimously approved by the Planning and Zoning Board. Luedke moved to approve the request, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Kohout, Luedke and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:25 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:40 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Clerk of the District Court, Joyce Wusk presented to the Board the Subgrant Agreement for Child Support with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services. Wusk explained that the previous agreements had been for one year, but this one was actually written as two-one contracts. McDermott moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Kohout, McDermott, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Wusk then announced to the Board that, after more than 30 years as Clerk of the District Court, she will be retiring effective August 31 of this year. The Board thanked her for many years of service.

Wusk also informed the Board that there has been discussion that the State of Nebraska is considering taking more control over the District Court system, which would make the state responsible for the salaries and benefits of court employees. This would be similar to the County Court structure.

Henning moved to approve the resolution, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were McDermott, Kohout, Luedke and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then updated the Board on the status of NEMA and FEMA payments, including one project that we have been advised will be denied.

At 11:35 a.m., the Board met with Nick Siedschlag, the only applicant for the open County Surveyor position. Mr. Siedschlag informed the board of his qualifications and experience. Luedke moved to appoint Siedschlag as Saline County Surveyor, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Luedke, McDermott, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the 1% Restricted Funds Limitation for budget purposes, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Luedke, McDermott, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.



Henning moved to approve the 2016-2017 EPC contract with Region V Systems, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve Resolution #2016-23, transferring \$17,569.66 from the Visitors Improvement Fund #0995 to the Veteran's Memorial Maintenance and Repair Fund #0999, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:45 a.m., Henning moved to enter Executive Session, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Luedke, Kohout, Henning, McDermott and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that during closed session, the Board would be discussing a request for catastrophic leave and two personnel issues.

At 12:02, Krivohlavek moved to exit Executive Session, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were McDermott, Krivohlavek, Luedke, Kohout and Henning, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, two personnel issues were discussed and no action was taken.

Henning moved to approve the catastrophic leave request discussed during closed session, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, Henning, Luedke, Krivohlavek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 12:02 p.m., County Attorney Eickman informed the Board of a recent U.S. Supreme Court decision, declaring that requiring a blood sample from a D.U.I. suspect amounted to coercion, and is, therefore, illegal. This means that Saline County will be purchasing an intoxilizer and providing training to deputies and jail personnel to perform BAC tests and to maintain the machine.

Luedke moved to approve the claims with the exception of claim #16070028, as there is a question of financial responsibility for part of the claim, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the July 12th, 2016 meeting, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Luedke, Henning, McDermott and Krivohlavek, Kohout abstained, nays none, motion carried.

Under report of officials, Emergency Management Director John McKee reported to the Board that he has met with all of the cities, towns and villages in Saline County except for Dorchester and DeWitt, with plans to meet with them during August. He informed the Board that the lights on the communications tower southwest of Wilber have been repaired and are now working correctly. Also, there has been a communications failure between NEMA and FEMA concerning the debris management program, which would fund large item garbage pick-up, so this program has been delayed.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda with the addition of the appointment of an interim Clerk of the District Court and, in closed session, a personnel issue, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the August 9th regular meeting, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were McDermott, Kohout, Henning, Krivohlavek and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Kohout reported receiving a letter from the Wilber Care Center, informing the Board of a Family Fall Picnic on September 18th, and asking for a donation of a personalized item to be auctioned. McDermott reported receiving an article regarding the relocating of the Saline County seat from Pleasant Hill to Wilber. Fikar reported receiving an \$80.00 check from Zito Media, a \$1.00 check from Granite Communications, a \$3.00 check from Interface Security Systems and a \$10.00 check from Level 3 Communications, all for 911 Surcharges, also received was the August 10th meeting minutes from the Saline County Ag. Society, along with their July expense report and a report of the Saline County Fair prize money and expenses, a signed agreement with Region V Systems for EPC services, from Blue Valley Community Action, their August 16th meeting agenda, their June 21st meeting minutes, their August Director's report and their news clippings from June and July. Received from SENDD was their August 18th meeting agenda and the minutes of their July 21st Executive Committee meeting, also received was a notice of meeting from the Saline County Wind Association and a notice from the City of Crete regarding a public hearing for a proposed annexation.

Under report of officials, Henning reported attending a CASA meeting, where they appointed a new Director, and attending a Public Health Solutions meeting.

Luedke reported attending a Saline County Ag. Society meeting, a Blue Valley Community Action meeting, attending several meetings with the courthouse addition architects, contractors and phone/internet providers. He will have a NIRMA Board meeting and retreat, along with the household hazardous waste collection coming up.

Kohout reported attending a Wellness Committee meeting, a Planning and Zoning meeting, a Safety Committee meeting, and reports that the Safety Committee has coordinated AED and CPR training classes for Saline County employees on October 26th and 27th. There will be two classes each day, at 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. He also reported a Saline County Historical Society meeting last Sunday, where he heard that they are working on the roofs that were damaged in the 2014 hail storm.

Krivohlavek reported attending a Saline County Aging Services meeting on Monday, where they are getting ready to start several new programs, including flu shot clinics at various locations around the county.

McDermott reported attending three courthouse addition contractors meetings, where they are comparing several new vendors for internet and phone service, had a meeting with the City of Wilber concerning the development of a community use area around the NRD pond on South Shimerda Street, attended a Wellness Committee meeting, a Safety Committee meeting, the ergonomics class hosted by NIRMA last week, a meeting with the contractors and members of the Treasurer's office. Coming up, he will have an LEPC meeting Thursday and another meeting with the contractors coming up.

At 9:43 a.m., Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber presented a minor subdivision for approval on behalf of Richard and Vicky Kuzelka. They wish to divide a portion of their property in section 18-5-4 for their daughter who will renovate or replace a house on the property. Luedke moved to approve the



request, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott, Luedke, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 9:46 a.m., Luedke moved to open the public hearing for discussion pertaining to conditional use permits to construct two meteorological towers, one in section 13 of Northfork precinct, and one in section 18 of Monroe precinct. A discussion followed concerning the height, location and set-backs of the towers.

Henning moved to close the public hearing for the conditional use permits, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Henning, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Luedke and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the conditional use permit for the meteorological tower in section 13, Norfolk precinct, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott, Henning, Krivohlavek, McDermott and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the conditional use permit for the meteorological tower in section 18, Monroe precinct, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Luedke, McDermott, Krivohlavek, Henning and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Weber then informed the Board that there will be a Planning and Zoning Committee meeting on September 20th to discuss the Milligan 2 wind tower project. The meeting will be at 7:00 p.m. at Saline Center hall.

At 9:58, McDermott presented for approval a set of Wellness Committee by-laws. The Board discussed the document and suggested that the Wellness Committee should consider adding a condition that the Board of Commissioners will approve the annual wellness program, and that the Wellness Committee member that is also a Commissioner will not have a vote on the Wellness Committee, since they will be able to vote while on the Board of Commissioners. Consideration of the by-laws was tabled to the next meeting.

At 10:19 a.m., Luedke moved to approve Resolution #2016-31, transferring \$26,537.37 from the General Fund to the Bailiff Fund, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Henning, McDermott, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution 2016-32, directing the County Treasurer to issue tax sale certificates for each parcel of real estate in Saline County in which there are delinquent taxes for three or more years. Motion was seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Luedke, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke reported to the Board that he had been investigating the several properties that have been offered to the public as a tax sale, and found that they may be failing to sell due to being over-valued. Potential purchasers may be discouraged from bidding because they would then be responsible for paying the taxes.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2016-33, directing the County Attorney to foreclose on all tax sale certificates which are held and owned by Saline County. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, Henning, McDermott, Luedke and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:33 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:48 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

The contract with Electronic Contracting Company of Lincoln, which will provide the security equipment for the courthouse was discussed. This contract was originally approved in October of 2015, but the financing failed to progress. The new contract does not include financing, and does include an extended five year warranty on the equipment. The price of the equipment with installation is \$150,917.00. Luedke moved to approve the contract, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, Luedke, Henning, Krivohlavek and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:53 a.m., McDermott moved to appoint Vergene Kracke as interim Clerk of the District Court effective September 1, 2016, until a final decision can be made. Motion was seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Luedke, Kohout and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:57 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 10:58 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi presented two requests to occupy right of way, both from G&K Holtmeier, Inc. One to bury water line, the other to bury electric cable, both between section 31-5-1 in Saline



County and section 6-4-1 in Jefferson County. Henning moved to approve both requests, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Henning, Kohout, Luedke and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi then presented an Agreement and Signing Resolution for Federal Aid Project #HRRR-76(49) to install railroad crossing markings on County Road I just east of Highway 103. The cost to the County will be \$300.00. Resolution #2016-34 authorizes the Board Chair to sign the agreement. Henning moved to approve Resolution #2016-34, authorizing the signature on the agreements, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Henning, McDermott and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.



Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

McDermott moved to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, McDermott, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the minutes of the August 23rd regular meeting, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the July 28th minutes and the August 25th agenda from 5 Rivers RC&D, the August 21st meeting minutes from the Saline County Historical Society, and a dividend check for \$27.88 from Reinsurance Group of America.

Under report of officials, McDermott reported attending an LEPC meeting on September 1st at Homestead National Monument, a courthouse construction meeting on September 2nd, will have a SENDD telephone conference at 3:30 this afternoon, a CURB Coalition meeting tonight, a meeting with prospective internet and telephone providers tomorrow, a Regional Coalition meeting on Thursday and a SENDD meeting on the 15th, which he will not be able to attend. Kohout may attend this meeting in his place.

Kohout reported attend an Employee Handbook Committee meeting on August 24th.

Luedke reported investigating two road complaints, a NIRMA Board meeting in Nebraska City two weeks ago and a courthouse construction meeting. He reported on a list of change orders for the courthouse addition and informed the Board that the extra windows that will be needed may take up to 29 weeks to receive, due to the window manufacturer's schedule.

Henning reported attending a Behavioral Health Advisory Committee meeting on August 31st, has a Region V meeting on September 12th, will be attending the NACO Southeast District meeting on Thursday and has a CASA meeting coming up.

Henning moved to approve the Clerk of the District Court's Report of Fees for August in the amount of \$2,709.75, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Kohout, Luedke, McDermott and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Commissioner Krivohlavek called in at 9:54 to be involved in the following presentation;

At 10:00 a.m., Corey Steel, State Court Administrator for the Nebraska Supreme Court presented information to the Board concerning an option for them to consider pertaining to the Clerk of the District Court position. It is his opinion that eventually the State of Nebraska will require all counties in the state to combine their County Courts and District Courts under one Administrator, and that the situation in Saline County could provide for that possibility prior to it being required. He stated that the advantages to this would be financial, as the state would then be responsible for the District Court staff salary. Neither, County Court Judge Bauer or District Court Judge Johnson had any objection to this plan. Ex-Clerk of the District Court Joyce Wusk informed the Board that there is more responsibility to the position than they may realize, and expressed doubts about one person being able to handle the administration of both courts. Daryl Wusk expressed doubts about the legality of making such a change, due to the population of Saline County, and the fact that the County has a true Clerk of the District Court, and not an ex-officio.

At 10:54 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 11:05 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Henning moved that bidding cease on the Crete Airport culvert project. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.



Bids were opened and read from VanKirk Brothers Contracting from Sutton NE; High Plains Enterprises from Martell, NE; TCW Construction from Lincoln NE; Yong Construction from Valley, NE and Collins Contracting Co., Inc. of Wahoo, NE. The bids are placed on file and are of public record in the Commissioners' Journal as attachment numbers 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 to these minutes.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi thanked all the bidders and stated that he would review all of the bids and come back at 11:00 on September 20th with a decision on the project.

At 11:15 a.m. Filipi presented a contract with Herbst Construction to construct a bridge for Wilber SW Project #C007603625, which had been approved during the August 9th meeting.



At 11:51 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would recess until 1:00.

At 1:00 p.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Brian Blobaum of Blobaum and Busboom, CPA's, was present for a budget discussion. Also present were Dan Drake and David McCracken of the Friend Community Healthcare Board. Drake and McCracken informed the Board that, during the last inspection by the Fire Marshall, the hospital was informed that they would be required to replace the back-up generator and all associated wiring. They do not yet have all of the bids, but the work is estimated to cost between \$600,000.00 and \$900,000.00. Therefore, they are requesting that the Board increase their final levy allocation for 2016 from \$154,220.00 to \$200,000.00.

McDermott moved to approve Resolution #2016-39, rescinding Resolution #2016-35, which set the final levy allocation for 2016 and was approved on August 23rd. Motion was seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Luedke, Henning, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve Resolution #2016-40, setting the final levy allocation for 2016, seconded by Henning. This resolution modifies the levy rate for the Friend Community Healthcare District from 0.026000 to 0.033718 and increases the approved amount from \$154,220.00 to \$200,000.00. Voting aye were Henning, McDermott, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

At 1:23 p.m., Emergency Manager John McKee informed the Board that the building which houses the radio equipment under the tower at Saline Center does not have an air conditioner, and the temperature in the building is too high for the equipment. He stated that an A/C unit for the building will be between \$2,500.00 and \$3,000.00, but he does not know what the electrical work will cost.

Saline County Sheriff Alan Moore was also present to discuss courthouse security with the Board. Once the courthouse addition is completed, there will be a security checkpoint, through which all visitors will be required to pass. The Board would like this checkpoint to be manned by a certified Deputy as soon as possible. Sheriff Moore states that qualified people are hard to find, but his office would begin a search, and estimates that, in order to man the checkpoint and monitor the entire building, he would need to hire three additional officers. This would cost approximately \$150,000.00, including salary, training and equipment.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi informed the Board that the transmission was failing in one of the pickups in the Road Department. He has found a used replacement vehicle at a cost of \$15,000.00.



The Board then had a discussion with Blobaum, considered these additional costs, and discussed raising the levy rate by 1.25 cents, or 4.7%. This would raise an additional \$286,000.00, reducing the amount needed to be transferred from the inheritance fund and maintaining necessary cash reserves. Blobaum will return at 10:00 a.m. on September 20th for the final budget discussion and approval.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 3:17 p.m. The next meeting will be on September 20th, 2016, at 9:30 a.m. in the Saline County Commissioners' Room, Courthouse, Wilber, NE.

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:33 a.m. on Tuesday, September 20th, 2016, by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Willis D. Luedke, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek and Tim McDermott, Commissioners and Daryl Fikar, County Clerk. Deputy County Attorney Steve Reisdorff was present between court commitments. Commissioner Janet J. Henning was absent.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three County newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda with the addition of general assistance request #2016-08, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the September 6th regular meeting, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were McDermott, Kohout and Luedke, Krivohlavek abstained, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the Region V Governing Board Sept. 12th agenda, as well as their June 13th meeting minutes and their September 6th Advisory Committee meeting minutes, the August 18th meeting minutes from Public Health Solutions, the September 15th meeting agenda and August 18th meeting minutes from SENDD, as well as their Executive and Budget Committee meeting minutes, the September 26th meeting agenda from Saline County Aging Services, Aging Partners Areawide Advisory Council September 22nd meeting agenda, and a notice from Lancaster County that they will be billing Saline County for a general assistance request that they had granted to a former Saline County resident that does not meet their residency requirements.

Under report of officials, Luedke reported attending a Fair Board meeting a couple of weeks ago, a meeting with Windstream concerning a possible new phone and internet system, the Southeast District NACO conference on September 8th, and has checked on tax foreclosed properties in Crete.

Kohout reported attending an Agricultural Society meeting, and has passed on an invitation to the Geneva Public Library on October 4th at 7:00 p.m. for a discussion about the death penalty referendum that will be on the General Election ballot.

Krivohlavek reported attending a Veteran's Service meeting on September 15th, will be attending a Planning and Zoning meeting at Saline Center tonight, and an Aging Services full board meeting on September 26th.

McDermott reported attending a SENDD eBoard meeting, reporting that the Executive Director, Dave Taladay has resigned, and that Craig Eberle will be the interim Director, he also attended a CURB Coalition meeting on September 6th, meetings with Windstream concerning the new phone and internet systems, a Regional Coalition meeting on September 8th, has a Planning and Zoning meeting tonight at Saline Center, a Wellness Committee meeting on September 26th, and a courthouse construction meeting on September 27th.

Luedke moved to approve the Sheriff's Report of Fees for August, showing Writ Fees, \$1559.00; Mileage, \$1,411.75; Inspections, \$590.00; Gun Permits, \$50.00 and Miscellaneous, \$30.00; totaling \$3,640.75. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, McDermott and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the County Clerk's Report of Fees for August in the amount of \$10,044.22, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Luedke and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

At 9:53 a.m., McDermott reported to the Board concerning the progress that has been made in finding a new phone and internet system and provider for the courthouse, jail, Aging Services and Extension Office. After comparing Unite Private Networks, Allo and Windstream, he reports that Windstream offers the best deal in terms of equipment and service. Krivohlavek moved to request from and sign contract with Windstream, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, McDermott and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:08 a.m., Krivohlavek moved to enter the public budget hearing for the 2016-17 fiscal year, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried. Brian Blobaum, CPA, explained the budget process, noting that there will be a 4.28% overall increase in the county tax request for the 2016-2017 budget year. County property valuation increased .49%, resulting in a levy rate increase from 29.3131 to 30.4198 cents per \$100 in valuation. County taxpayers will pay \$11.07 more per \$100,000 in valuation this year compared to last year. The tax request for 2016-2017 is \$6,966,784.00 compared to \$6,680,500.00 last year. The general levy will be .275030 compared to .263820 last year.

The jail bond fund is the same as last year at \$420,146.00 with the bond levy at .018345 compared to .018435 last year. This is due to a slight increase in valuation.

The courthouse bond fund is the same as last year at \$247,860.00 with the bond levy at .010823 compared to .010876 last year. This is due to a slight increase in valuation.

Krivohlavek moved to close the public hearing, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Luedke, Kohout, Krivohlavek and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve Resolution #2016-41, Resolution of Adoption and Appropriations, adopting the budget for 2016-17, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:20 a.m., Krivohlavek moved to open the special public hearing to consider a change in property tax request, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Luedke, Kohout, Krivohlavek and McDermott, nays none, motion carried. The property tax request was discussed, for the 2016-17 fiscal year, the general fund request is \$6,298,778.00 compared to \$6,012,494.00 for the previous year. The combined bond fund request is the same as the previous year at \$668,006.00.

McDermott moved to close the special public hearing seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Krivohlavek, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve Resolution #2016-42, changing the property tax request for fiscal year 2016-17, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Kohout, Luedke and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:29 a.m., Luedke read change order #4 to the Board having to do with the courthouse addition. The changes include installing a vehicle sensor in the driveway to the sally port, additional millwork in the County Attorney's Office, replacement of the parking lot on the west side of the courthouse, additional wood trim in the County Courtroom, conversion of a planned mailroom into an office, changing the location of an electrical panel, electrical and ductwork changes in the court reporters office, installation of a conduit to facilitate an antenna connection to the roof and adding a drop power pole in room #124 to make electrical power available to a desk that is not against a wall. The total amount for these changes is \$130,065.00. Luedke moved to approve change order #4, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Kohout, Luedke and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.


At 10:40 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short recess.

At 1:30 p.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene in a public hearing to consider a request from Aksamit Resource Management to issue a conditional use permit for the purpose of constructing a windfarm project in Saline County.

Jason Edwards, Vice President of Development for Aksamit Energy Development, a subsidiary of Aksamit Resource Management outlined plans for the project, indicating that they planned to begin construction of the windfarm in the spring or summer of 2017 and planned to have it in production by July of 2018.

Members of the public that were present and speaking were Kenneth Kreshel, Scott Sobotka, representing Lower Big Blue Natural Resources District, Reece Sukovaty, Darrel Hayek, Tim Pribyl, Dennis Broz, Debbie Spanyers, David Vavra, Nicki Zalesky and James Jirsa.

Concerns expressed by the opponents of issuing the conditional use permit were noise, health effects, flickering during sunrise and sunset, lowering of land valuations, harm to wildlife, proximity to homes and land boundaries and the opinion that the towers are eyesores. There was also concern that, once the permit is issued, the owner of any property in the footprint of the project would be able to sign up and construct additional towers without having to go through the process of issuing a conditional use permit.

Proponents of the project noted that a wind project is preferable to having other types of power generation projects in the county, and that there will be tax benefits to the county.

At 3:18 p.m., Luedke moved that "having heard the testimonies of the opponents and the proponents and reviewing the research literature on wind energy, and in the best interest of Saline County, I move that we recognize the affidavit authorizing the signature of Jason Edwards, Vice President of Development as a legal representative of Aksamit Energy Development and that Saline County grant a conditional use permit for the purpose of building a commercial wind energy conversion system in Saline County, Nebraska". After questioning by McDermott, motion was later amended to include, "based on the attachment indicating the landowners and legal descriptions". Henning seconded the motion. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke and Henning. Abstaining were Krivohlavek and Kohout, motion carried.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 3:23 p.m. The next meeting will be on October 18th, 2016, at 9:30 a.m. in the Saline County Commissioners' Room, Courthouse, Wilber, NE.

Motion was seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout, Henning and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the Saline County Visitors Committee Promotion Fund Grant recommendations of \$350.00 to McIntosh Ministries of DeWitt, \$2,000.00 to the Saline County Historical Society and \$1,000.00 to the Western Community Club. Motion was seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Luedke, Henning, Krivohlavek and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

#### SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, November 1st, 2016, by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Willis D. Luedke, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek and Tim McDermott, Commissioners and Daryl Fikar, County Clerk. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments. Commissioner Janet J. Henning arrived at 10:03 a.m.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three County newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Luedke moved to approve the agenda with the addition of consideration of approval of General Assistance application #2016-10. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott moved to approve the minutes of the October 18th regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were McDermott, Kohout, Luedke and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving a copy of the Nebraska Association of County Official's 2015-16 audit, the Saline County Agricultural Society's October 12 meeting minutes, a community survey from Public Health Solutions as well as their October 20th meeting agenda, the Southeast Nebraska Emergency Management Region's November 3rd meeting agenda, SENDD's October 20th Executive Board meeting agenda, the Saline County Tourism Advisory Committee June 23rd meeting minutes, copies of the Southeast Nebraska Tourism Council's May 6th, June 2nd, July 1st, August 6th and September 2nd meeting minutes, a \$12.00 check from Atlantax Systems, a \$1.00 check from Granite Telecommunications, a \$93.00 check from Zito Media, an \$11.00 check from Level 3 Communications and a \$20.00 check from Vonage, all for 911 Surcharges.

Under report of officials, McDermott reported attending the Saline County Coalition Red Ribbon week presentations at all 4 Saline County schools, plus one at Meridian. He reports that Todd and Jamie Calfee of Lincoln, who lost a daughter in an accident with a drunk driver, related their experience at all of the schools. McDermott noted that they did a wonderful job, considering that it involved reliving an incredibly bad experience. He also reported attending a SENDD Executive Board meeting on October 20th, where they are making preparations to begin interviews for a new Executive Director, a site visit with Windstream for the Aging Services, Extension Office and County Attorney's Office, a Wellness Committee meeting on October 25th, a meeting with the Courthouse addition contractors on October 25th, attending the NIRMA AED/CPR class and meeting with the electrician to determine what wiring will be needed for the new phone/internet system. Coming up, he has a regular Coalition meeting on November 10th, and a CURB Coalition meeting on November 14th.

Krivohlavek reported attending a SCAT meeting on October 20th, reporting that they are going to have a kick-off celebration for the Wilber area service beginning on Thursday, she also attended the special Commissioners meeting on October 21st, a Saline County Aging Services Executive Board meeting on October 24th and the NIRMA AED/CPR class on October 27th.

Kohout reported investigating two road complaints, attending the Planning and Zoning meeting on October 18th, a mutual aid meeting in DeWitt where Officer Dawn Jonas of the Crete Police Dept. announced "Operation under the tree", which is a toy donation program for Christmas presents for area children, he also attended the Wellness Committee meeting and the NIRMA CPR/AED class.

Luedke reported a Blue Valley Community Action meeting two weeks ago, a meeting with local officials concerning the Wilber NRD lake, informing the Board that even though the property is within Wilber City limits, some of the upstream ponds will have to be addressed, he also has a Blue Valley Community meeting tomorrow, a meeting with the company that is providing shelving for the new County Attorney's Office, attended the NIRMA CPR/AED class and gave a report to the Board concerning Saline County's equity statistics and refunds from NIRMA.

At 9:52 a.m., Marci Fehlhafer introduced herself to the Board as the new Director of CASA.



At 9:56 a.m., Saline County Aging Services Director Amy Hanson presented the Board with changes to their by-laws. The Board questioned the change concerning what is considered to be a quorum at their Board meetings. The by-laws were changed from 55% of the membership needed to be considered a quorum to 40% needed to be a quorum. The Board of Commissioners suggested that a quorum should not be less than 50% of the membership, and also suggested that appointments be made on a primary/alternate method. Hanson will take these suggestions back to the Aging Services Board for their consideration.

At 10:07 a.m., Planning and Zoning Director Lyle Weber and Nicki Zalesky presented a minor subdivision for approval in section 18-3-4 for Dan Zahourek to subdivide 8.29 acres from his property in section 18-7-4. Luedke moved to approve the subdivision, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott, Krivohlavek, Luedke and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:10, Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi, Assistant Highway Superintendent Bill Slezak, County Treasurer Debbie Spanyers, Veterans Service Officer Forrest Doyle, Planning and Zoning Administrator and Weed Superintendent Lyle Weber, Extension Agent Randy Pryor, County Assessor Brandi Kelly and Clerk of the District Court Amber Mulbery were present to discuss the changes in the rules governing exempt employees. On December 1, 2016, the minimum salary level for exempt employees is increasing from \$23,600.00 to \$47,476.00. This change will affect 13 county employees. These employees, with possibly several exceptions, will now be paid hourly instead of as salaried employees.

At 10:39 a.m., the Board began a discussion about the need for a Human Resources, Information Technology, Administrative Assistant position. Concern is raised that all of the changes in labor laws, as well as not having an IT person on site necessitates the creation of a new employee position. A job description has been created that was researched from similar positions in other counties. After review, Luedke moved to approve the job description, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, Luedke, Kohout, Krivohlavek and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:13 a.m., McDermott moved that bidding cease for a dump truck, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott, Henning, Luedke and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Bids were opened and read from Truck Center Companies of Lincoln, NE and from RDO Truck Center of Lincoln, NE. The bids are placed on file and are of public record in the Commissioners' Journal as attachment numbers 1 and 2 to these minutes.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi thanked all the bidders and stated that he would review all of the bids and come back at 11:00 on November 15th with a decision on the project.

Filipi then made his recommendations to the Board for culvert projects C-76 (743), C-76(749) and C-76(750). He recommended, for projects C-76(743) and C-76(749) be awarded to Malone Construction of Douglas, NE and that project C-76(750) be awarded to Husker Engineering of Burwell, NE. Henning moved to accept the recommendations, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, McDermott, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 11:57 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a short break.

At 12:06 p.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

Henning moved to approve the County Clerk's September report of fees in the amount of \$10,555.50, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott, Luedke, Henning and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve Resolution #2016-49, transferring \$6,194.00 from the General Fund to the Adult Drug Court Fund #2380, as proposed in the 2016-17 budget. McDermott seconded the request. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Luedke, McDermott and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

The Board reported the receipt and review of the County Treasurer's distress warrant report. The report indicates that 75 distress warrants were submitted to the Saline County Sheriff for collection, totaling \$42,227.14.

At 12:08 p.m., Krivohlavek moved to enter Executive Session, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were McDermott, Krivohlavek, Luedke, Kohout and Henning, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that



during closed session, the Board would be discussing burial assistance applications #2016-06 and #2016-07, and general assistance application #2016-10.

At 12:26 p.m., Krivohlavek moved to exit Executive Session, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, Henning, Krivohlavek, McDermott and Luedke, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that a decision on burial assistance application #2016-06 has been postponed, pending the gathering of more information.

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:31 a.m. on Tuesday, November 15th, 2016, by Chairperson, Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Willis D. Luedke, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek and Tim McDermott, Commissioners and Daryl Fikar, County Clerk. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments. Commissioner Janet J. Henning was absent.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three County newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings law posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, McDermott, Kohout and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the minutes of the November 1st regular meeting, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Kohout, Luedke and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Fikar reported receiving the November 17th meeting agenda, the September 22nd meeting minutes and the 2016-17 budget from 5 Rivers RC&D, the November 11th meeting agenda from SENDD, and the November 15th meeting agenda, the October 18th meeting minutes and the November Report to the Board of Directors from Blue Valley Community Action.

Emergency Management Director John McKee presented a monetary agreement with Jefferson County to cost share a subscription to AlertSense, which is a reverse 911 system that will provide to County residents, by telephone call, emergency alerting and critical communication services. McKee informed the Board that the service will be available only to County residents that live outside of the city limits of Crete and have a landline. Cell phone alerts are available, but the owner will have to register their telephone number. After discussion, McKee stated that he will talk to Beatrice communications, who oversees the City of Crete dispatching, to see if Crete can somehow be included in this service. He stated that the service should be available on or before January 1, 2017. McDermott moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Luedke, Krivohlavek, Kohout and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.

Under report of officials, Luedke reported attending a Blue Valley Community Action meeting in York, a meeting with the vendor for the new phone and security systems, and has another BVCA meeting coming up, as well as County Government Day tomorrow and an RC&D meeting on Thursday.

Kohout reported visiting the Probation District #1 office in Beatrice, where they inquired about the timeline for the addition to the courthouse, as the downtown Wilber office will be moving in after the construction is complete, he also reported investigating a road complaint.

Krivohlavek reported having an Aging Services Executive Board meeting coming up on November 28th and informing the Board that she may not be able to attend, as she will most likely be on maternity leave at that time until the end of January, and commented that she is ready to distribute the performance reviews to the Veterans Service Committee for them to complete for the Veterans Service Officer. At 10:13 a.m., McDermott presented to the Board the 2017 Wellness booklet and documentation, stating that the most notable changes from 2016 are the alternate physical activity category and a system for pro-rating the scoring system for new employees. At 10:21 a.m., McDermott presented for approval a copy of the by-laws for the Employee Wellness Committee. Under correspondence, Korbelik reported receiving the November 17th meeting minutes from Five Rivers RC & D Council Meeting, a \$5.00 check from Granite Telecommunications for 911 surcharges, the November 16th meeting minutes from Saline County Agricultural Society, Hope Crisis Center Board of Directors meeting from November 7th, funding notification for Public Health Solutions to prepare for National Accreditation and a \$395.00 Grant check from NIRMA for reimbursement on the Varidesk.

Under report of officials, McDermott reported attending the NACO Conference in Kearney on November 14th, 15th and 16th, a Union Negotiations Meeting, met with the local electrician on the rerouting of cables for the Treasurer's office, also mentioned that tonight would be the last SENND meeting, which is an emergency meeting, for trying to find a new director. The job was offered to a second individual and he also turned the job down. Building Committee meeting was moved to January 4th, 2017, reported on a NIRMA Grant that was approved for the Security Equipment for the Courthouse and the Health Fair was turned down.

Kohout reported attending the Saline County Christmas party at the Extension office, the NACO Conference in Kearney, the Reverse 911 Training in Plymouth, the

P & Z Meeting on December 20th and reported that the fire drill at the Courthouse on December 21st resulted in the Courthouse being evacuated in 4 minutes and 30 seconds.

Luedke reported attending the NACO Conference in Kearney, attended the union negotiation meeting, the Reverse 911 training in Plymouth, the fire drill at the Courthouse, the RC & D Meeting, Luedke also met with the Contractor and the Architect about the Treasurer's office. They may need to close the office and will need to get it posted for the public. Is planning to attend the Probation Office meeting coming up, has received the estimates for the shelving for the attorney's office. Reported that the shredders are here today shredding more out of the storage box.

At 9:45 a.m., Apex presented a conditional use permit. Apex would like to erect a MET Tower to measure wind at Section 4-5-1E. The Zoning board approved the permit. Luedke moved to approve the permit, motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

There was an emergency item added to the Agenda. Christina Lyons with the Gage County Crime Commissions presented a Grant Application for the Juvenile Diversion program to the Board. Planning & Zoning presented a Contract to the Board from Hanna-Keelan to update the Saline County Zoning Regulations and Comprehensive Plan. The Planning & Zoning Board voted to approve the contract and Lyle Weber, Planning & Zoning Administrator, highly recommended approving the agreement. The cost will



be \$20,000.00. Luedke moved to approve the contract with the correction of the date from August 31, 2016 to August 31, 2017 for a finish date. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve the Courthouse insurance coverage to insure for replacement cost. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Change order #6 was discussed and postponed due to no paper work or data. Will be discussed when the Board receives the paperwork and data.

Luedke moved to approve the Revised Report of Fees for the Clerk's office for August in the amount of \$10,044.72, September in the amount of \$10,571.00, and October 2016 in the amount of \$12,962.50 and the County Clerks Report of Fees for November 2016 in the amount of \$21,165.47. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Union Contract will be discussed during closed session.

At 10:20 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would take a recess.

At 10:35 a.m., Kohout announced that the Board would reconvene.

John McKee, Saline County EM, gave a monthly report. McKee reported that there will be a SE EM Region Governance Board Meeting at Gage County EOC in Beatrice on January 5, 2017 starting at 10:00 A.M., the Debris Management Plan is still waiting on the State/FEMA for the approval, Flood Management books have come in, Homestead Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) will meet at 1:30 P.M. at the Homestead National Monument on March 2, 2017, County fire drill went well and had everyone out of the building in 4 min. 30 sec., talked about the County wide ID Cards, McKee met with the Crete Schools and the Crete Area Medical Center on Emergency Preparedness and the ID Cards, a notice has been sent to the schools for the Severe Weather poster contest for 2017 and talked about the Saline and Jefferson County Alert Sense Reverse 911 system training in Plymouth.

Luedke moved to approve Resolution #2016-60, transferring \$4,000.00 from the General Fund to the Grant Fund, to be reimbursed when Grant funds are received. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve Resolution #2016-61, transferring \$250,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the County Building Fund. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve Resolution #2016-62, transferring \$15,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the General Fund, to be reimbursed to the Inheritance Tax Fund when funds become available. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Luedke moved to approve Resolution #2016-63, transferring \$55,000.00 from the Inheritance Tax Fund to the Road Fund, to be reimbursed to the Inheritance Tax Fund when funds become available. Motion was seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were McDermott, Luedke and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout motioned to close the bidding for project Bridge Structure C007602505, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Kohout, McDermott and Luedke, nays none, motion carried.

Bids were opened and read from Simon Construction of North Platte, NE., JJK Construction of Lincoln, NE., Herbst Construction Inc. of Iowa, Midwest Underground of Syracuse, NE. The bids are placed on file and are of public record in the Commissioners' Journal as attachment numbers 1, 2, 3, and 4, to these minutes.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi thanked all the bidders and stated that he would review all of the bids and to come back on January 10, 2017 at 11:00 A.M. with a decision on the project. Filipi also touched base on trees being removed by Tobias, signs and evening inspections.

At 11:14 a.m., Luedke moved to enter Executive Session, seconded by McDermott. Voting aye were Luedke, Kohout and McDermott, nays none, motion carried. Kohout announced that, during closed session, the Board would be discussing Burial Assistance Application #2016-06, General Assistance #2016-11 and Union Negotiations.

At 11:52 a.m., McDermott moved to exit Executive Session, seconded by Luedke. Voting aye were Luedke, Kohout and McDermott, nays none, motion carried.
