

### SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:32 a.m. on Tuesday, January 5, 2021 by Chairperson Marvin A. Kohout. Present were Kohout, Russ Karpisek, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, and Philip Hardenburger Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Kohout advised those present of the open meetings act posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve the minutes of the December 22, 2020 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Gary Veprovsky addressed the Board to ask them to think about any action they may take on the Milligan 1's request to cross a County's drainage easement. This request is a current agenda items for today's Board meeting.

Jeff Koll made a request to have a different Planning and Zoning Board liaison other than Kohout named during the reorganization today.

Under Correspondence, Bartels reported receiving from the City of Crete, the December 28<sup>th</sup> agenda for the Planning Commission; the January 4<sup>th</sup> agenda for the Planning Commission Special Meeting; the January 5<sup>th</sup> agendas for City Council regular meeting, the Public Works Committee meeting, the Legislative/Economic Development Committee and the Public Safety Committee meeting; an IRS notice stating the standard mileage rate for 2021 has changed to 56¢ per mile; an email from Spencer Hopp with S & P Global reporting Saline County has a AA- long term rating; and a letter from NACO announcing the retirement of their Executive Director Larry Dix, the new Executive Director will be John Cannon, who will assume the role on February 1, 2021.

Kohout moved to approve Karpisek as Chairperson, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Krivohlavek and Kohout, abstaining was Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek began presiding over the meeting as Chairperson.

Karpisek thanked Kohout for his leadership and years of service as the Board Chairperson.

At 10:03 a.m. McDermott and Mulbery, and Tim McPherson with AV Associates of Nebraska, presented a consultation agreement for the planning of the potential upgrade of the District Court audio visual equipment. Henning moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Agreement to Provide Professional Consulting Services with Maximus US Services. Maximus identifies various costs incurred by the County to support and administer federal programs. The motion was seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays one, motion carried.

County Treasurer Debbie Spanyers requested the release of pledged securities from Farmers & Merchants Bank, CUSIP #68905WDT6, in the amount of \$100,000.00, Resolution #2021-006. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Spanyers requested the release of pledged securities from City Bank & Trust, CUSIP #912828A83, in the amount of \$250,000.00, Resolution #2021-007. Krivohlavek moved to approve, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Spanyers requested approval of a new pledged security from City Bank & Trust, CUSIP #91282CAR2, in the amount of \$250,000.00, Resolution #2021-008. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:30 a.m. David Levy, an attorney with Baird Holm LLP, representing Milligan 1 Wind, requested consent to bury cable under the Right of Water Use from Water Conservation Reservoir and Drought Wells from Vaclav J. Suda to Saline County, Nebraska and successors, recorded November 26, 1934 in Book 79, Page 435; records of Saline County, Nebraska. Levy confirmed the current landowner is aware of this request and this consent will in no way be an imposition to the County. Henning moved to approve the request, after changing the verbiage in section 5(b) to with consent of the other party hereto, seconded by Krivohlavek.





Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, and Krivohlavek, nays Karpisek, abstain with conflict Kohout, motion carried.

At 10:47 a.m. Karpisek announced the Board would take a recess;

At 11:03 a.m. Karpisek announced the Board would reconvene;

At 11:05 a.m. Henning moved to cease the bids for the Concrete Box Culvert Project, Structure #C007613125, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Bids were opened and read from Gus Construction Co., Inc., of Casey, IA; Van Kirk Bros. Contracting of Sutton, NE; JJK Construction LLC of Ceresco, NE; M.E. Collins Contracting Co., Inc. of Wahoo, NE and Reece Construction Co., Inc. of Salina, KS. The bids are placed on file and are of public record as attachments 1 through 5 in the Commissioners' Journal to these minutes. Filipi thanked the contractors for submitting their bids and announced the bids will be reviewed and a decision will be announced during the Commissioners' meeting on January 19, 2021.

Filipi presented for approval a Request to Occupy County Right-Of-Way from Windstream Nebraska, LLC. This request is to replace an 1100' section of cable at County Road E, east of County Road 1200. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi updated the Board on various road and snow removal activities throughout the County.

Filipi reported the Roads Department is in need of a new semi-truck. He is looking to piggy back on a recent truck bid Otoe County received. He does not have it budgeted for this fiscal year, however, he can order it now and take possession of the truck in May, and pay for it in the next fiscal year.

Krivohlavek moved to approve Resolution #2021-002, voluntarily extending the FFCRA benefits of Emergency Sick Leave and Emergency Family Medical Leave, to conclude June 30, 2021, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-005, updating the Register of Deeds Fee Schedule, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-001, transferring \$16,554.18 from the General Fund to reimburse the Aging Service Fund for employee benefits, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-003, transferring \$275,500 from the Inheritance Fund to the General Fund, to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-004, transferring \$6,500 from the Inheritance Fund to the Grant Fund, to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

It was decided to hold performance reviews for appointed officials on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2021 at 1:00 p.m. These reviews will be done with each individual with the full Board present.

Thank you, God Bless you, and God Bless the United States of America". After which, Mr. Kronhofman thanked the Board and received a standing ovation.



Henning moved to approve the County Clerk fees for December 2020, in the amount of \$29,763.00, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the December 2020 Clerk of the District Court fees in the amount of \$8,753.27, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the December 2020 Sheriff Fees – Writ Fees \$1,680.00, Mileage \$1,578.25, Vehicle Inspections \$470.00, Gun Permit \$95.00, and Miscellaneous \$6.00, totaling \$3,829.25, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

County Weed Control Administrator Lyle Weber presented his annual report for approval. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the Declaration of Surplus Property and removal of items from the County Clerk's inventory, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:25 a.m., Karpisek announced the Board would recess;

At 10:32 a.m., Karpisek announced the Board would reconvene;

Saline County Tourism Committee member Sheryl Kastanek presented the Committee's Promotion and Improvement Grant recommendations for approval. Hardenburger moved to approve, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Karpisek opened discussion regarding the Employee Wellness Program. Karpisek stated he has received a number of concerns, especially for next year with the policy of going to all device. Krivohlavek noted she has received phone calls as well. A number of officials and employees addressed the Board expressing concerns to include, but not limited to, basing points on 10,000 steps is a narrow path of health, noting walking for a 25 year old versus a 65 year old can look very different and still offer health benefits to both; there are many other forms of exercise or working out which do not register with a wearable device; some employees do not have a computer at home to download a wearable device; some have issues with wearing a Fitbit; questions were raised as to why flu shots and the health fair are no long available to spouses; why holidays were no longer double points; the program is no longer fun, now it's like another job; there used to be fun activities and contests between offices; making the change to wearables only would only serve to make it easier for the committee not the employees. A few responses to these concerns were, the cost and insurance submission issues drove the decision to exclude spouses from flu shots and the health fair; holidays would no longer offer double points because of the software when downloading your data; and the decision to go strictly with wearables was made because it was thought to be easier. Employees were encouraged to attend the next Wellness Committee meeting to express their concerns, along with possible solutions.

At 11:10 a.m., Kim Showalter with Public Health Solutions, via teleconference, and John McKee, Saline County Emergency Manager gave reports on COVID vaccine availability. Vaccinations for Group 1A are expected to be finished this week. The Department of Health and Human Services is setting the criteria for Group 1B, which includes individuals age 65 and over and those with chronic health issues. McKee has contacted the Saline County Ag Society to inquire if the Fairgrounds may be a possible location for a mass COVID vaccination site.

McKee announced the County will be receiving CARES Act monies for the reimbursement of Law Enforcement and Dispatch salaries.

At 11:30 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi recommended accepting the bid submitted by Van Kirk Bros. on January 5<sup>th</sup> for the Concrete Box Culvert Project, Structure #C007613125. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.



Filipi presented Constructors Inc., Change Order No. 2, for the Crete East Overlay Project for approval. This change order is due to the original contract item Overrun/Underrun, the total project cost will be decreased by \$25,358.16. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi presented Resolution 2021-013 Certifying Proper Completion of Project for County Bridge Matching Agreement Number BL1911, structure number C007603425. Krivohlavek moved to approve, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi reported on another Jefferson/Saline County bridge project. Roads is continuing to clean trees and ditches out in preparation for summer bridge and culvert projects.

Filipi confirmed any new 911 signs requested for private property, will be provided by the County for a fee of \$50.00. The owner of the property is responsible for installing the sign.

The question of signage noting Saline County as a livestock friendly county was addressed. The signs were believed to be posted at each highway entrance to the County. Filipi is going to check to see which signs may be missing.

Due to the Board of Commissioners reorganization, Hardenburger moved to add Chairperson Russ Karpisek and remove previous Chairperson Marvin A. Kohout as a signatory on the Imprest Bank Account XXX620, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried. Karpisek thanked Kohout for his leadership and added the change in Chairperson was due to Kohout and Karpisek agreeing it would be beneficial to rotate the responsibility of Chairperson amongst each of the Board members.

McDermott presented Cheever Construction Change Request Number PR DD and Change Order #16, in the amount of \$3,925.00, for secure corridor door replacement materials. Individuals interested in serving on the Planning & Zoning Board are requested to submit their request in writing to the Board of Commissioners by noon on January 29, 2021, stating what they will bring to the Planning & Zoning Board and why they want to serve. Interviews will be scheduled for each submission.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-009, transferring \$123.03 from the discontinued Drug Court Fund 2380 to Drug Court Fund 2390, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-010, transferring \$110,000 from the Inheritance Fund to the General Fund, to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-011 transferring \$45.00 from the Inheritance Fund to the Employee Wellness Fund, to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-012 transferring \$3,400.00 from the Inheritance Fund to the Juvenile Services Aid Program, to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Bartels, Deputy County Clerk Jennifer Hermsmeier and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Under Correspondence, Hardenburger reported receiving an unsigned letter. It was not given any consideration or discussed due to being unsigned.

Under Report of Officials, Krivohlavek reported that the Aging Services program is growing, they have been very busy and looking forward to changes.

Hardenburger reported attending the Planning and Zoning meeting.

Kohout reported filling in for Krivohlavek at a Saline County Area Transit meeting, he attended a NACO Position Meeting; Planning and Zoning Meeting, a Mutual Aid meeting to discuss communication methods (pager, radios, digital) for Fire Departments, NACO Officer and Board meeting, and a NACO Legislative Bill Review meeting; an Employee Recognition meeting, and upcoming Safety and Wellness meetings.

Karpisek reported he may not be able to attend the upcoming Wellness meeting. They will be counting up the points for the fitness program only.

Henning reported an RC&D Meeting.

Bartels reported that the Highway Bond closed and the first payment will be made in April. The Courthouse Bond is closing on February 8, 2021. The claim was submitted for \$23, 687.67 to wire on Friday.

McDermott reported on the Pam Bourne ADA webinar, it was a good refresher. He has a meeting on the 22<sup>nd</sup> with Tim McPherson about the District court sound system, a meeting with Unite Private Networks (UPN), a competing fiber network company, they will be getting a quote on phone/internet services in comparison to Windstream. The NIRMA online University is still in use but is geared towards Law Enforcement. We will continue to use Continuum for now. On the 29<sup>th</sup> he attended the NIRMA board meeting. On the 1<sup>st</sup> a wellness meeting to restructure the program. Jamie Houser was appointed secretary and the members will stay the same. ### SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:40 a.m. on Tuesday, February 16, 2021 by Chairperson Russ Karpisek. Present were Karpisek, Marvin A. Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, and Philip Hardenburger Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Karpisek advised those present of the open meetings act posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Karpisek, Krivohlavek, Kohout, Henning and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the February 2, 2021 regular meeting, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Karpisek, Hardenburger and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Jeff Koll addressed the Board, thanking them for streaming live the last Planning & Zoning meeting and requested the meetings continue to be streamed. He requested considering recording them via YouTube, thereby not depending on real time internet connections. Koll inquired which Saline County committees have By-Laws. Koll reported Sandra Koll filed a complaint with the State of Nebraska, Office of the Attorney General, regarding alleged violations of the Open Meetings Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. §§84-1407 to 84-1414 by the Saline County Planning and Zoning Administrator. Upon completion of their process, her complaint was reviewed to determine if the situation warranted immediate action by their office for knowing violations of the Open Meeting Act. The Nebraska Office of the Attorney General determined that it did not. There is insufficient evidence to determine whether the Planning & Zoning Board failed to publish notice of its January 22, 2020 meeting or improperly amended the February 19, 2020 agenda. While contemplating no further action regarding this complaint, the Planning & Zoning Board was admonished through this letter that strict compliance with the Open Meetings Ace in the future is imperative.

Gary Veprovsky thanked the responsible party for correctly posting the Planning & Zoning Board minutes. Veprovsky reported Gerald Horak had contacted him stating he was disappointed in only receiving a response from Karpisek, when he sent correspondence regarding his disapproval of wind development, to all the members of the Board of Commissioners.

Under Correspondence, Bartels reported receiving from Blue Valley Community Action their February 16<sup>th</sup> agenda, minutes of their January 19<sup>th</sup> zoom meeting and the February 2021 Reports to the BVCA Board; from Blue Valley Behavioral Heath a report in the first 6 months of this fiscal year, they have seen and treated 36 substance abuse Saline County clients; email and phone correspondence with Tyson Larsen regarding Redistricting Saline County; Notice of a Special SENDD Board of Directors meeting on February 22<sup>nd</sup>; from the City of Crete, the Planning Commission agenda for February 15<sup>th</sup> and the February 16<sup>th</sup> agendas for the City Council, Parks & Recreation Committee, Public Works Committee and Finance Committee.

At 10:00 a.m., Veteran Service Committee member Lyle Bartels and Karpisek recognized Harvey Weber with a Certificate of Appreciation. The certificate reads "The Saline County Commissioners wish to Recognize your military service to the United State of America. Throughout our Nation's history, it is the effort of the men and women, such as yourself, that have provided the freedoms we, as Americans, dearly enjoy today. At 10:16 a.m., Anita Stougard representing the Saline County Youth Diversion Program, presented for approval a 4 Year Community Plan for Youth Diversion. Upon receiving approval, Stougard will be applying for funding grants. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the January 2021 County Clerk fees in the amount of \$28,592.40, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the January 2021 Clerk of the District Court fees in the amount of \$17,317.68, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the January 2021 Sheriff Fees; Writ fees \$1,359.00; Mileage \$1,125.01; Vehicle Inspections \$560.00, Gun Permits \$160.00 totaling \$3,204.01, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Discussion was held on the Planning & Zoning Commission and Board of Adjustment By-Law Applicability. Eickman stated one of the issues we're looking at is to track down the date of their adoption, including signatures. It appears these documents were generated between 2000 and 2010. Bartels and Weber have searched for a signed copy, an approval given in minutes and/or a resolution approval. Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Stephanie A. Krivohlavek, and Philip Hardenburger Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers prior to the meeting, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Karpisek advised those present of the open meetings act posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout moved to approve the minutes of the February 16, 2021 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve the minutes of the February 22, 2021 special meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence Citizens Forum, Karpisek read aloud an email from Neil and Jessica Formanek, outlining the issues they are experiencing in regards to Milligan 1 Wind Farm-specifically turbine 88. The basis of their concern is with every spin of the turbine, the shadows flicker into their home every evening that is sunny from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM. After multiple efforts having been made in contacting EDF, nothing has been accomplished.

Chuck McKay at 1433 County Road 900 addressed the Board. McKay had seen Jessica Formanek's post on the shadow flicker. He stated at 7:15 in the morning he has the shadow flicker and the turbine is over a mile away from his house. He has also brought to the attention of the Planning & Zoning Committee the decibel concerns he has. He has a decibel meter on his farm, this morning the readings were between 74 and 86. He also has an infrasound meter, stating normal infrasound for people is 20 which is a low frequency sound, his reading this morning was 40 every time the blade moved. He stated the Planning & Zoning Board and Commissioners have put them in a zone where it's an irritant to be outside and he's irritated nothing is being done. McKay stated the Planning & Zoning Committee has been a nightmare to deal with, including Horak and Jansky having a conflict of interest. He expressed concerns with Lyle Weber not answering his phone, and believes Weber should be measuring the distance of the towers from power lines, property and the highway. McKay questioned how much tax money has been received from the wind company.

Jack Sukovaty via teleconference addressed the Commissioners, stated he would like to second the comments Chuck made, stating he felt the Planning & Zoning Committee either had not read the regulations or did not understand them. The Committee is either not listening or they do not care what the public has to say about the wind tower setbacks. Sukovaty stated the livestock regulations are terrible. The way these regulations are written now, if you have a Class 1 feedlot, with a 1,000 animal unit, you can put it up 600 feet from your neighbor. He stated he hopes both the wind and livestock regulations are opened up to be looked at and updated, which he stated in a letter to the Commissioners, receiving no questions or comments. Karpisek replied he did not recall receiving a letter pertaining to livestock regulations. Hardenburger stated he and Jack did talk and Hardenburger did have a number of questions. Hardenburger also noted he had talked with Weber about them also.

Chris Krivohlavek at 961County Road L, stated the lights don't both him, you get used to them. It is noisy, his regulator reads 45-50 decimals. Stating according to the lawyer for the County, if the rules are changed a lot and you don't have legal reason to, other than just doing it, the County can be sued by all land owners for not being able to make money on their property.





Under Correspondence, Bartels reported receiving the 2020 Annual Report from NIRMA; and from the City of Crete, the March 2<sup>nd</sup> agendas for the City Council, Public Works Committee, Finance Committee and Legislative and Economic Development Committee.

Karpisek reported receiving a notification from the Nebraska Association of Emergency Management, including nomination forms for awards presented in April 2021; tax foreclosure letters from the County Attorney and notification of NACO continuing education opportunities.

Under Report of Officials, Henning reported she had a CASA meeting later today;

Karpisek reported attending the Wellness Committee meeting and was unable to attend the SENDD meeting regarding a SENDD land purchase;

Kohout reported attending the last Planning & Zoning meeting; the Employee Health Fair and has upcoming meetings for the Employee Recognition Banquet and a SE NE District meeting;

Hardenburger reported attending the last Planning & Zoning meeting and has an upcoming 5 Rivers RC & D meeting.

Krivohlavek reported she also received a phone call from Jessica Formanek discussing the shadow/flickering issue the Formaneks are experiencing; a phone call addressing the issue of Page My Cell, which the caller stated they did not believe Emergency Management was making a priority, even though Page My Cell is the secondary means of contact.

McDermott reported attending the Employee Health fair and Wellness Committee meeting; and has upcoming meetings with the Wellness Committee, LEPC Homestead; Know Your Numbers and NACO.

Emergency Manager John McKee reported the COVID vaccinations are going well. Public Health Solutions is working to get any individual in an approved group, who may have been missed, a vaccination as soon as possible.

McKee gave an update on the Page My Cell concern. McKee had contacted Diode to determine what had caused the incident of Page My Cell not working. Diode informed McKee they had performed an update and failed to notify Emergency Management. McKee again stated Page My Cell is the secondary means of notification for emergency personnel.

Extension Education Nathan Muller and Engagement Zone Coordinator Megan Burda, presented the Nebraska Extension in Saline County Annual Report.

Muller requested approval of the 2021 Extension Board Members. Krivohlavek moved to approve, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none motion carried.

Muller requested approval of the Nebraska Extension in Saline County Constitution and By Laws. This approval was tabled until the March 16<sup>th</sup> meeting, to allow the Board time to review the documents.

At 10:23 a.m., Karpisek announced a short recess;

At 10:32 a.m., Karpisek announced the Board would reconvene;

Kohout made a motion to seat any new Planning & Zoning Board members, being voted on today on March 17, 2021, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Kohout and Henning, nays Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Karpisek, motion failed.

A ballot listing the applicants for the open positions on the Planning & Zoning Board was distributed to each commissioner. Upon submitting their voted ballot, the ballots were counted and tabulated by 2 members of the Clerk's office. The top four candidates were Keith Muller, Johnny Barta, Jeffrey Koll and Joel Weber. Hardenburger moved to approve the appointment of Muller, Barta, Koll and Weber, effective March 2, 2021, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Bartels opened discussion to begin the process for the renewal of the Public Defender Contract which expires June 30, 2021. Current Public Defender Scott Gropp was present offering suggestions on the bidding



process in general. Gropp also noted the case load has increased significantly, and the increased need for interpreting, which should be noted during this process. Henning moved to begin the process, with Eickman and Bartels being tasked with working together on the necessary documentation, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-021 extending the Wind Moratorium through March 31, 2021, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Krivohlavek, nays Kohout, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Addendum #1 to Interlocal Agreement Creating the Seward/Saline County Solid Waste Management Agency, adding the Village of Garland, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-022 transferring \$5,362.64 from the General Fund to Aging Services as proposed in the 2020-2021 budget, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-023 transferring \$27,977.10 from the General Fund to the Bailiff Fund as proposed in the 2020-2021 budget, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-024 transferring \$280,000.00 from the Inheritance Fund to the General Fund to be reimbursed when fund become available, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-025 transferring \$1,600.00 from the Inheritance Fund to the Juvenile Services Aid Program Fund to be reimbursed when fund become available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi, reported on various ongoing road projects. Filipi also reported he will be again advertising for a mechanic. He received zero applications from the recent employment ad.

Kohout moved to approve claims as presented, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

#### SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:30 a.m. on Tuesday, March 16, 2021 by Chairperson Russ Karpisek. Present were Karpisek, Marvin A. Kohout, Janet J. Henning, and Stephanie A. Krivohlavek Commissioners, County Clerk Anita K. Bartels, and Administrative Assistant Tim McDermott. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments. Commissioner Philip Hardenburger was absent.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers on March 10, 2021, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Karpisek advised those present of the open meetings act posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the March 2, 2021 regular meeting, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Gary Veprovsky addressed the Board. A synopsis of his statements included guilt by association and shame on you, regarding when and how to appoint the new Planning and Zoning people. Veprovsky questioned Eickman whether or not he had a conversation on this matter with Kohout, Eickman confirmed he had a conversation with Kohout. Veprovsky then addressed Bartels, shame on her for not having this conversation in the minutes, and shame on the rest of the Board for approving the minutes as submitted. Veprovsky was critical of actions the Board has taken, especially singling out Kohout, stating this has to stop and the Board needs to make it stop. He stated he has been against wind from day one and he feels there is not fair representation,

Krivohlavek commented on Veprovsky's remarks, stating she believed there was no deceit in Kohout's conversation with Eickman. Kohout was just notifying the Board of their conversation and Counsel was aware of what was going to happen. As Board members, conversations are often had with Counsel for advice on how to handle situations. Often in Board meetings, discussions are put on hold to wait for Counsel to be available. To shame the Board for not taking an additional step to talk to our Counsel, when we did exactly what we were supposed to do in the right way. As to the Clerk, the minutes are an abbreviation of what has transpired at the meeting, and this has been the case since day one. Krivohlavek stated she puts meetings on Facebook because she wants it to be transparent. The Board recognizes they may not be right 100% of the time, but to be shamed for doing the right thing is really frustrating.

Under Correspondence, Bartels reported receiving from the City of Crete, the March 16<sup>th</sup> meeting agendas for the City Council, Public Works Committee, Finance Committee and Legislative & Economic Development Committee; from Blue Valley Community Action, their March 16<sup>th</sup> meeting agenda for their Board of Directors, the Minutes of the February 16<sup>th</sup> Board of Directors zoom meeting and reports to the BVCA Board of Directors; from SENDD an announcement their March 18<sup>th</sup> meeting will be virtual; an email from the State Auditor's office regarding setting up a separate Fund and revenue code for the money the counties will be receiving related to the COVID American Rescue Plan Act signed by the President; a letter from the Nebraska Commission and Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, notifying the County the Saline County Jail was visited and evaluated and it was determined the facility to be in full compliance; and receiving a check from the State of Nebraska in the amount of \$11,220.70 for COVID related expenses incurred during the elections. Bartels reported attending the SE District NACO meeting on March 12<sup>th</sup>. During the round table discussions with other County Clerks, a common practice is to only record in the minutes the names of individuals addressing the Board during the Citizen Forum and to request a written request including relative documentation, be made to a Commissioner or directly to the County Clerk, from individuals wishing to be on an agenda with an item that might require the Board to take action. By submitting a written request, it gives the Board time to research an issue if necessary. The Citizens Forum would continue to be available to hear concerns, with no action taken. After discussion, the Board requested Bartels and County Treasurer Debbie Spanyers work together to set up the new fund for the COVID American Rescue Plan Act. Eickman was



requested to research the practice of listing only the names of individuals speaking during the Citizen Forum and requesting written requests for agenda action items. If appropriate, Resolutions to set up the new fund and the new practices would be presented at the next meeting.

Anita Stougard presented the 2021 Community based Juvenile Services Aid grant with the Nebraska Crime Commission for approval and Board Chairperson's signature. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

McDermott presented the amended COVID Guidelines for County staff, stating the amendment was for the addition of item 10) Quarantine for Vaccinated Individuals. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance states that fully vaccinated individuals who meet certain criteria will no longer be required to quarantine following exposure to someone with COVID-19. Kohout moved to approve the amended COVID Guidelines, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Saline County Emergency Manager John McKee reported to the Board via teleconference. McKee confirmed McDermott's presentation of the updated CDC guidance. He also reported just receiving and emailing to the Board a new DHM issued on March 16, 2021, stating he hasn't had time to digest it all yet. Public Health Solutions is continuing to report on the status of the availability of the COVID vaccine. They are hoping soon to get to the point of making mass vaccination clinics available. McKee recommended going to the Public Health Solutions, click on the link to sign up for the vaccine, it's a very easy process to enter your information, especially individuals 50 and over should be signing up now. The link to click on is vaccine.ne.gov to register.

McKee gave an update on the flooding over the weekend. The Big Blue, Turkey and Swan Creeks are coming down. He has been in contact with DeWitt and will continue to monitor the situation.

McKee reported he is continuing to work to resolve the Page My Cell issues. He has installed another computer and equipment in his office, on another network and is currently in the testing mode. He'd like to give it a couple days of testing before reporting it's all good to go.

Under Report of Officials, Henning reported a Public Health Solutions zoom meeting on Thursday;

Karpisek reported the purchase of a building for SENDD is in flux and he attended the Wellness Committee meeting;

Kohout reported on attending an Employee Recognition meeting, the Saline County Wind Association meeting in Ohiowa, a Wellness Committee meeting, a Know Your Numbers meeting, the SE District NACO meeting and on Thursday he has a Seward/Saline County Waste Management meeting;

Krivohlavek stated there will be a Saline Aging Services full board meeting next Monday which she will be unable to attend and requested the alternate attend in her place.

McDermott reported attending the Wellness Committee meeting. At this meeting it was decided not to base points solely on wearables for 2022 and Stephanie Roth of Crete Area Medical Center will offer a class on the topic of Plant Based Eating, March 31<sup>st</sup>. The LEPC meeting was postponed until April 4<sup>th</sup>; he had a meeting with Unite Private Networks who are at the cusp of submitting a proposal. He reported attending a Know Your Numbers meeting, the SE District NACO meeting, a kick off meeting with Mid Continental for the tuck pointing of the Courthouse and March 24<sup>th</sup> is designated the tornado drill warning day.

At 10:34 a.m., Karpisek announced the Board would recess;

### SALINE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

The regular meeting of the Saline County Board of Commissioners was called to order at 9:33 a.m. on Tuesday, March 30, 2021 by Chairperson Russ Karpisek. Present were Karpisek, Marvin A. Kohout, Janet J. Henning, Philip Hardenburger and Stephanie A. Krivohlavek Commissioners, and County Clerk Anita K. Bartels. County Attorney Tad Eickman was present between court commitments.

Notice of said meeting was posted in the County Clerk's Office, on the Saline County Website, and published in all three county newspapers on March 24, 2021, in compliance with State Statutes.

Let the record show that all proceedings are electronically recorded.

Karpisek advised those present of the open meetings act posted at the back of the room.

Henning moved to approve the agenda seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Kohout moved to approve the minutes of the March 16, 2021 regular meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, Hardenburger abstained, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Brian Pribyl addressed the Board.

Under Correspondence, Bartels reported receiving a notice from SENDD for a Special Board meeting on March 31<sup>st</sup>, a Blue Valley Community Action Open House on April 8<sup>th</sup>, and from Fillmore County Zoning notice to Adjoining Counties and Villages of Fillmore County for a Public Hearing on April 13<sup>th</sup> to amend Fillmore County Zoning Regulations Article 5.1 AG-1. Bartels reported speaking with Laura Nigro with the State Attorney General office regarding a meeting's minute content and the open meeting act, according to Nebraska State Statute 84-1413. Bartels also reported a voicemail on the Commissioner's phone line from Daryl Musil, stating Jordan Musil was resigning from mowing the Waymire Cemetery.

At 9:44 a.m., District Court Clerk Amber Mulbery and Tim McPherson with Striv AV, requested approval from the Board to commence with a Request for Proposal and to begin the bidding process for the installation and materials required to upgrade the technology in the Saline County District Courtroom. Krivohlavek moved to approve, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:00 a.m., Veteran Service Committee member Lyle Bartels, introduced Navy Veteran Alfred E. Wollenburg, who was presented a Certificate of Appreciation by Board Chairman Russ Karpisek. The certificates reads "The Saline County Commissioners wish to recognize your military services to the United State of America. Throughout our Nation's history, it is the effort of the men and women, such as yourself, that have provided the freedoms we, as Americans, dearly enjoy today. Please accept our deepest gratitude and appreciation. Let us never forget your demonstrated sacrifice, service, love and commitment to your country. Thank You, God Bless You and God Bless the United State of America". After which, Mr. Wollenburg thanked the Board and received a standing ovation.

At 10:10 a.m., Brad Swiggert with Northwestern Mutual addressed the Board, requesting the opportunity to provide a quote to Saline County for health insurance. Swiggert also stated Northwestern Mutual has merged with The Olson Group, located in Omaha. The Olson Group Benefit Team also offers HR Consulting to their customers. The Board agreed to initiate the quote process for health insurance, which would be an online or paper census collected from all employees. The Board is also interested in reviewing the HR Consulting benefits offered by the Olson Group.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-029 to establish a new and separate fund known as the COVID American Rescue Plan, Fund #2580, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

At 10:26 a.m., Karpisek announced the Board would recess;

At 10:41 a.m., Karpisek announced the Board would reconvene;

County Treasurer Deb Spanyers presented for approval of the Public Tax Sale Report, held on March 1<sup>st</sup> at Sokol Hall. She reported 33 bidders, with 78 certificates issued totaling \$145,500. Henning moved to



approve, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber reported the new Planning & Zoning Board officers are Johnny Barta President, Wayne Miller Vice President, and Mary Jo Weber Secretary. Weber stated there was not a vote taken at the last Planning & Zoning meeting on the same issues discussed at several previous meeting. During discussion, Hardenburger requested the Chairman of the Planning & Zoning Board call for a vote at their next meeting on these issues. Weber commented the next Planning & Zoning meeting is scheduled for April 20<sup>th</sup>. Krivohlavek issued a statement she would make a motion to extend the wind moratorium, but this would be the last time she would support one.

Krivohlavek moved to extend the wind moratorium to May 4, 2021, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Karpisek, Kohout and Henning nay, motion carried.

After the wind moratorium motion and vote, it was determined the first May meeting of the Board of Commissioners was May 11, 2021. Krivohlavek and Hardenburger rescinded their previous motions.

Krivohlavek moved to extend the wind moratorium to May 11, 2021, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Karpisek, Kohout and Henning nay, motion carried.

Weber and Dan Pavlish presented a minor sub-division application for property in the SW <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 24-7-3, 5 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> acres near 1800 County Road and K. Krivohlavek moved to approve, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve Resolution #2021-030, transferring \$206,000 from the Inheritance Fund to the General Fund, to be reimbursed when funds become available, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi updated the Board on driveway work, cleaning ditches and rock hauling. He is working with IEA and EDF to get the roads repaired west of Highway 15. Filipi is ordering the gravel and rock, haulers are putting it down and the cost is being paid by EDF. There are 22 miles of gravel totaling \$106,500 and 13 miles of rock totaling \$193,190.40.

Filipi presented a request to occupy right-of-way from KW Farms at 350 County Road C, to bore or bury electric cable/utility line. Henning moved to approve, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

The acceptance of bids for C007622030/CBMP#5/c76(815) was tabled until the next meeting.

Filipi recommended accepting the bid from Constructors Inc., in the amount of \$491,924.67, for the Saline County Asphaltic Concrete Overlay Project-Crete South. Hardenburger moved to accept the bid as recommended, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Under Report of Officials, Krivohlavek reported since she was out of town, she requested Kohout to attend the Saline County Aging Services meeting and Karpisek to attend the DeWitt Planning & Zoning chicken farm meeting. She did receive a phone call expressing concerns about the DeWitt chicken farm. She also reported driving along the property where an earlier complaint was submitted on wind tower flickering. By driving this area at different times of the day, there was no flicker from the wind tower, noting it appeared the tower is facing a different direction.

Hardenburger reported attending the March 10<sup>th</sup> Ag Society meeting and was out of town for the Blue Valley Community Action meeting which was held on the 16<sup>th</sup>.


Karpisek reported attending the DeWitt Planning & Zoning chicken farm meeting.

Williams explained to the Board she will be taking over the operation of the Blue River Lodge from Dan Troyer, this requires a liquor license in her name.

Kohout reported attending an Employee Wellness and Employee Recognition meeting, on Friday a NACO insurance meeting, on Tuesday the 20<sup>th</sup> the Safety Council will give a presentation to the Wellness Committee, Wednesday is a NACO zoom meeting with the Governor, next week is a communications meeting followed by a Mutual Aid meeting and next Friday a NACO Board of Directors meeting;

Henning reported having a Region V Governing Board meeting.

At 11:00 a.m., Highway Superintendent Bruce Filipi recommended to the Board to accept the bid for Bridge C007622520 (76-778) from Van Kirk Bros., Sutton, NE in the amount of \$208,567.10. Henning moved to approve the March 2021 Clerk of the District Court fees in the amount of \$34,046.27, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Henning moved to approve correcting Lori Moldenhauer's salary to \$44,561.92 effective January 1, 2021, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Bartels opened discussion to increase/update the shelving in the County Clerk's records vault. She stated initial inquiries suggest the cost would be between \$30,000 and \$40,000. The shelving would be similar to the units in the Assessor, County Attorney and District Court vaults. This service is designed to be dispatch specific. McKee is to notify Crete we would like to have them included in this service and confirm if they want to be included.



Karpisek advised those present of the open meetings act posted at the back of the room.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the agenda with the additional of discussing and possibly approving the Soarin Group quote, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve the minutes of the June 22, 2021 regular meeting, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Under Citizens Forum, Chuck McKay, Gary Veprovsky and Darrel Hayek addressed the Board.

Under Report of Officials, Hardenburger reported an upcoming meeting with the Saline County Ag Society;

Kohout reported having a NACO Board zoom meeting and checking the cemeteries in his district;

Krivohlavek reported Saline County Area Transit holding a meeting on Thursday and she will be attending the Valuation Protest Hearings on Thursday;

Karpisek reported attending an Employee Wellness Committee meeting.

At 9:45 a.m. Kohout moved to open the Public Hearing for Amendments to the Planning and Zoning Regulations, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger and Henning, nays none, motion carried.

Planning and Zoning Administrator Lyle Weber, read and explained the Saline County Planning Commission's recommended changes to the Saline County Zoning Regulations as follows:

- 1. Amendment to Section 619 (E)(1)(C)(2), page 63, to remove the wording: "not in my backyard".
- 2. Amendment to Section 619 (E)(1)(e)(2), page 64, amend setbacks (as set forth in the Minimum Setback Requirements for Wind Energy Conversion box) as follows:

Amend the setback from occupied buildings on abutting properties of non-participating land owners from 1200 feet to 2640 feet or 5 times the system height, whichever is greater.

Amend the setback from property lines of non-participating landowners from 1.1 times the system height to 2.0 times the system height.

Make no amendment to the setback from public road right-of-way and maintain a setback of 1.1 times the system height.

3. Amendment to add language, after the Minimum Setback Requirements for Wind Energy Conversion box as shown in Section (619) (E)(1)(e) as set forth on page 64 of the zoning regulations as follows:

"Any wind turbine shall not exceed 40 decibels (dba) measured at any dwelling using the "A" scale".

- 4. Amendment to Section 619 (E)(1)(e)(3), page 64, SHADOW FLICKER, to remove the language "less than 1,000 feet of any wind turbine".
- 5. Amendment to Section 619 (E)(1)(e)(6), VISUAL IMPACTS, subsection (C), to add the following language, at the end of VISUAL IMPACTS, subsection (C) on Page 65: "All new night time lighting shall be by an aircraft detection activated lighting system installed by the applicant that shall meet or exceed FAA standards with proof of FAA permitting".
- 6. Amendment to any sections of the Zoning Regulations dealing with livestock in the Agricultural District to eliminate the need for a Conditional Use Permit (CPU) for a Confined Animal Feeding



use when moving from a Class I to a Class II with written notice to any occupied dwelling within one (1) mile.

During the Public Hearing, David Levy, Attorney for EDF Windfarm and citizens Gary Veprovsky, Dennis Pallas, Darrel Hayek, Chuck McKay, Jeff Koll and Jack Sukovaty were heard regarding these proposed amendments.

Krivohlavek moved to approve Amendment 1 as written, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

In the second paragraph of Amendment 2, Krivohlavek moved to remove "the 5 times the system height, whichever is great, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Kohout, and Krivohlavek, Karpisek nay, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve Amendment 2 as amended in the previous motion, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Henning, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays Karpisek, motion carried.

Kohout moved to approve paragraphs 3 and 4 of Amendment 2 as written, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, and Henning, nays Karpisek, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to include the verbiage "using the "A" scale for a continuous 10 minute LEQ (Level Equivalent) over a 24 hour period" in Amendment 3, seconded by Hardenburger. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning and Karpisek, nays Kohout and Hardenburger, motion carried.

Krivohlavek moved to approve Amendment 3 with the additional verbiage approved in the previous motion, seconded by Karpisek. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Henning and Karpisek, nays Kohout and Hardenburger, motion carried.

Voting aye were Henning, Karpisek, Kohout, Krivohlavek and Hardenburger, nays none, motion carried.

Filipi updated the Board on a bridge replacement with a culvert southeast of Friend, and various other road projects.


Filipi did advise the property by Crete, the County is looking to sell, needs to be advertised and a public hearing held. Eickman and Bartels will work on getting this scheduled.

John McKee, Emergency Manager gave an update his ongoing projects regarding goal planning on LEOP; the radio system moving toward digital with First Wireless and the paging system going back to E-Dispatch along with Page My Cell. McKee reported Everbridge is working, Diode will no longer be supporting point to point between towers and having weekly conference calls with Kim Showalter at Public Health Solutions on COVID variants.

At 10:27 a.m. Karpisek announced the Board would recess;

At 10:40 a.m. Karpisek announced the Board would reconvene;

Brian Blobaum, CPA with Blobaum and Busboom, presented an update of the proposed budget for 2021-2022. Blobaum had two major changes, which were adding \$432,700 for capital improvements and the reduction of revenue of law enforcement housing. The Board accepted Blobaum's recommendation of a 2.62% total levy rate.

Henning moved to approve Resolution 2021-057, Pursuant to LB 77-3443, the County Board of Commissioners of Saline County hereby resolve to set the final levy allocation for 2021, seconded by Kohout. Voting aye were Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek and Kohout, nays none, motion carried.

Treasurer Debbie Spanyers presented the 2021 Uncollected Distress Warrant Report, totaling \$9,689.04 for approval. This report included a request to have stricken from the tax roll, Distress Warrant #10 in the amount of \$93.03, Distress Warrant #57 in the amount of \$65.50 and Distress Warrant #61 in the amount of \$51.66. Krivohlavek moved to approve, seconded by Henning. Voting aye were Hardenburger, Henning, Karpisek, Kohout and Krivohlavek, nays none, motion carried.

Hardenburger moved to approve the minutes of the November 9, 2021 meeting, seconded by Krivohlavek. Voting aye were Kohout, Krivohlavek, Hardenburger, Henning and Karpisek, nays none, motion carried.

Under correspondence, Bartels reported receiving from the City of Crete the agenda for the Planning Commission meeting on November 22<sup>nd</sup> and their November 16<sup>th</sup> agendas for the Public Work, Public Safety and Finance Committees, along with the City Council meeting.


